Why on the "G" in ESG?

- Within Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG), "G" refers to the governance factors of decision-making.
- The "G" element is often forgotten, or neglected, amid considerations over emphasis on climate and social issues.
- Yet, poor governance stands at the core of the critical failure of private companies and government.

ESG and **Government**

- How "G" in a public organization, particularly in government, influence politics?
- People ask for accountability from the government for delivering public services – voting for politicians for successful delivery or voting against politicians for failing delivery.


Theories of Policy Feedback

- "New policies create a new politics" (Schattschneider, 1935)
- Broader *governance* could shape the political landscape, including public policies, bureaucracies, or interest groups.
- Policies are not only *effects* but potential *causes* of politics (Pierson, 1993, 1994, 2000)

Theories of Policy Feedback

- Examples:
- Social Security and Medicare enhanced seniors' political participation (Campbell, 2003)
- G.I. Bill's effects on young veterans from WWII, their later life political socialization → "earned right" (Mettler, 2005)
- Various welfare programs' effect on trust in government or political attitudes (Soss, 1999)


Mechanism of Policy Feedback



Theories of Policy Feedback

- Resource effect: material resources and incentive shape patterns of political attitude/behavior
- Example: Affordable Care Act (ACA) on political participation
- Interpretive effect: cognitive and psychological processes lead to political attitude/behavior
- Example: Perception of inequality on political trust

Efficacy: ability to produce an intended result



Political Efficacy: ability to change / influence government



Political Efficacy and Politics

Public like me don't have any influence over what the government does.

- 나와 같은 사람들은 정부가 하는 일에 어떠한 영향도 미칠 수 없다.


Public officials don't care much what people like me think.

% who say ___ by party and level of political efficacy ...







Korea Social Integration Survey (사회통합실태조사)


- Published annually since 2013, by the Korea Institute of Public Administration (한국행정연구원).

- Survey social & political participation, trust, governance, public services, fairness, and others.






Mechanism of Policy Feedback



Satisfaction with community center on political efficacy




Satisfaction with issue of document on political efficacy




Risk of Corruption and Fairness in Governance


- i) Corruption poses an obstacle to investment in environmental and social protection.
- ii) Material or interpretive effects become less important for political attitudes if procedural justice is violated.
























How satisfied are you with issue of identity document via internet?



ESG and Government: Lessons

- Political efficacy is likely to be elevated when people receive a better public service delivery.
- Governance becomes the key to enhancing public service delivery.
- Material or interpretation is not enough: corruption and fairness also need attention for governance.
